

KNOWLEDGE TEST

A.A. 2025/2026 ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCES AND CIVIL PROTECTION

Admission to the degree course in **Environmental Sciences and Civil Protection (class L-32 R)**, for the academic year 2025/2026, is open.

A non-selective and non-binding test for enrolment is carried out for the verification of disciplinary knowledge and for the verification of the English language. This test will take place on a digital platform, from September 2025 to May 2026, on the following disciplines:

- Mathematics (Basic Mathematical Language)
- Physics
- Chemistry
- Biology
- English

The subject knowledge test consists of 24 (twenty-four) multiple-choice questions, with one correct answer out of the five indicated, on the following topics

- Mathematics (Basic mathematical language) 6
- Physics 6
- Chemistry 6
- Biology 6

For each discipline there are **6 (six)** multiple-choice questions, with one correct answer out of the five indicated.

The assessment criteria for both tests are as follows:

- a) 1 point for each correct answer
- b) 0 points for each incorrect answer.

The test is considered successful with 2 out of 6 correct answers for each section.

For the Physics, Chemistry and Biology sections, the test is for the sole purpose of self-assessment by the student.

Candidates who score less than 2 out of 6 correct answers in the Mathematics section alone will be assigned the Additional Formative Obligation (OFA) in Mathematics to be fulfilled in the first year of the course (by 10 August).

Candidates who score less than 2 out of 6 correct answers in the English language proficiency test will be allocated the additional training obligation (OFA) for English to be met in the first year of the course (by 10 August).

Exemption from the knowledge test

The following are exempt from taking the knowledge test:

- candidates coming from degree courses established according to the regulations in force prior to Ministerial Decree 270/2004;
- candidates already in possession of another academic qualification, including one obtained abroad or already enrolled on university-level study courses abroad;
- students transferring from a degree course at this university or transferring from another university with a passed mathematics examination;

- candidates who have already successfully passed the knowledge test in the 2024/2025 academic year or in a previous academic year for courses of study in the Sciences or courses at another teaching structure of this University or at other universities and in the latter case duly certified;
- lapsed or withdrawn students already enrolled in a science course who request enrolment.

Exemption from the English language proficiency test

- students in possession of level B2 language certification;
- students who are native speakers of English.

All those who fall into one of the above cases are required to fill in the appropriate form on enrolment.
